- UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

Crime data is for July 2016. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

The two Dwelling burglary crimes took place in Sudbury town. The offenders for the first were known to the home owner and have since been located and interviewed. The second involved a report of missing compact discs from a home but no signs of forced entry having been established. We are victim led when it comes to crime recording and so must record offence's as they are reported unless evidence suggests otherwise.

- CURRENT ISSUES

-We recently had four offence's of criminal damage at four different churches in West Suffolk (one in Bildeston and others in rural Stowmarket/Bury St Edmunds). These crimes unusually, involved a small amount of material being chipped off the corner of a number of gravestones. Previously, we have also suffered lead theft offence's. Rural churches are often targeted due to their isolated locations so members of the public are asked to report any suspicious activity they see. Stealing a large amount of lead takes time and a reasonably large vehicle to transport it, so any early reports will assist police in locating offenders.


- Between 29th Aug 2016 and 1st Sept 2016, four burglaries at business premises took place. Two were at out buildings and two at main buildings. Area affected are Glemsford x 1 / Newton / Little Cornard x 2 / Long Melford x1. There have also been offences in other parts of Suffolk. Investigations are underway to establish if all linked.

- CRIME REDUCTION ADVICE

Following recent reports of bogus callers in the West of the county (NOT IN SUDBURY LOCALITY), we are encouraging friends, family and neighbours to spread the word to ensure everyone is aware of distraction burglaries or bogus callers so that they do not become a victim. If they witness any suspicious or unusual behaviour then immediately call police on 999. People can take the following steps to guard against bogus callers:

- Think before you open the door, and keep all your doors and windows secure whilst you answer the front door.
- Consider displaying a 'No Cold Calling sticker' on your door. Please contact your safer neighbourhood team for more information.
- Always ask for ID – take it from the caller through the letterbox and read it carefully, and do not admit anyone who you feel is not a genuine caller.
- Keep an eye on neighbours, friends and family - call 999 if you think a bogus caller is at your property.

- OTHER INFORMATION

- Thank you for the amazing response to our request for CCTV monitoring volunteers at Sudbury Police Station. We are already at the 'security vetting' stage and hope to have the new volunteers in place soon.

- Police Connect is a free messaging service connecting you to the very latest policing news and information for any local area of Suffolk that you wish to specify, (e.g. where you live or where you work). You can choose to receive messages via text, email or phone.
