- 1- Single male perpetrator identified. Close liaison with the local authority housing provider and other agencies allowed additional needs of wider community to be met. Suspect ultimately arrested and placed on remand. Housing provider currently seeking possession through the civil court for the property.
- 2- worked with landowner and other agencies as well as small private enterprise to educate offending parties and move the perpetrators off the land to a more suitable location.

### - UPDATE ON CRIME DATA

Crime data is for May 2017. This is to ensure that all crimes during a month are captured accurately. Unfortunately, not all crimes will be reported and counted by the time our newsletter is published (7th of each month) and so this delay ensures that the data received is correct and a true reflection of what has taken place. We will mention any more recent crime series within the further information area if appropriate.

- There were 7 burglary (dwelling) reports for the month. Locations were Boxted, 3 x Great Cornard (including newly built properties, unoccupied), Long Melford, and 2 x Sudbury (including one house being built),

- At the beginning of June, Police investigated possible reports of a teenage female being assaulted by an adult male in the Great Waldingfield area. The assault was concerning, however, despite an extensive media campaign, no suspect was identified. We are confident that this is an isolated incident, and despite some rumours circulating that this was an attempted abduction, we stress that there is nothing to support this but, as always with this type of incident, we are keeping an open mind.


- We continue to investigate a robbery that occurred at the Gainsborough service station in Sudbury in June. The silver Vauxhall Astra involved was discovered burnt out having made off from the scene.

## CURRENT ISSUES

-We are investigating a current trend in vehicle badges being stolen in the Long Melford area, as well as working with our Haverhill colleagues looking at sporadic reports of thefts from vans whereby tools and number plates are being stolen. We are currently following up a vehicle that may have been involved in some of these thefts.

## OTHER NEWS

Suffolk's Police and Crime Commissioner, Tim Passmore continues his 2017 series of public meetings across the county. He will be visiting Sudbury on Wednesday 20th September, at All Saints Parish Church on Church Street, CO10 2BL.

Following the successful format of last year, the PCC will stage a meeting in each of the 18 Safer Neighbourhood areas. The meetings are an opportunity for the public to ask questions of the Commissioner and the Constabulary, and to find out more about policing in the county.

Each meeting will involve a quick overview from Tim Passmore and the local Inspector and then the public will have an opportunity to ask questions. The local Superintendent responsible for policing in the local area, will add operational context.

There is no need to book, please just turn up. Tea and coffee will be served from 6.40pm.
