In the 7 months to 31st March 2018, 749 drivers have been prosecuted across 13 Parishes for excess speed. This includes 170 in Lavenham and 147 in Long Melford.

Responding to issues in your community

Police are appealing for witnesses following a serious sexual assault in Sudbury in the early hours of Monday 28 May. The victim – an 18-year-old woman – reported to officers that she was raped at around 3.30am on Monday 28 May in an area of grassland between First Avenue and Second Avenue.

She is being supported by specialist trained officers, as detectives have been undertaking initial enquiries into the incident. The suspect is described as a white male, with curly hair and a beard and was possibly wearing a dark leather jacket. It is believed he spoke with a foreign accent.

Detectives are appealing for anyone who was in the vicinity of First Avenue, Second Avenue or Waldingfield Road (B1115) between 2.30am and 3.30am on the morning of Monday 28 May, and who may have any information relating to this incident to contact them. Officers are urging members of the public to remain vigilant when out at night, to plan your journey home and avoid going off alone. Calls should be made to 101 quoting reference CAD 55 of 28 May. Alternatively contact the charity Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.
