You said...

Target the anti social use of motorvehicles during the period of heavy snowfall in the public car parks in Sudbury.

We did...

Enlisted the support of local businesses and deployed unmarked vehicles in strategic places, tasked by an officer monitoring CCTV, we successfully engaged, and legally warned drivers acting in this manner. Another warning will lead to a full prosecution and seizure of the vehicle.

Responding to issues in your community

We responded to a number of calls concerning the arrival of several caravans belonging to members of the travelling community in Sudbury. We enlisted the support of our partners, particularly Suffolk County Council, and positively engaged with the group ensuring that their immediate welfare needs were met, along with balancing these against the needs of the community. We ensured that local businesses were kept up dated with developments, and carried out site visits on a regular basis until they departed the area.

Making the community safer

On the lead up to the National Knife Crime Week, PCSO Skeggs carried visits to our senior schools and gave every year group an input on the law, the dangers associated with carrying knives, and positive messages about how to help those that may feel the need to carry knives. The supportive inputs have received positive feedback, and spearheads the start of a local commitment to prioritising information relating to young people involved directly or indirectly with knife crime.

Preventing, reducing and solving crime and ASB


Following numerous reports in the community of a young male committing a high number of criminal acts, we arranged and facilitated multi-agency meetings, held the young person's mother to account, and pro actively engaged with him. By placing additional restrictions on him, and encouraging those with parental control to be firmer with him, we have seen a reduction in offending. The next stage is a formal police interview which will take place this week, with a decision to then be made on what criminal sanctions will be placed upon him.
