Responding to issues in your community

During the month of November there were a total of 218 investigations in Woodbridge (Investigations relate not only to recorded criminal offences, but also safeguarding individuals). Parishes have been affected by, residential / garage / shed burglaries, thefts from motor vehicles, criminal damage and ASB incidents. Investigations also include reassurance and crime reduction surveys.

Making the community safer

During the darker evenings we encourage residents to review home security to prevent Dwelling Burglaries. Make your house look occupied with lights and a radio on timers. Do not leave valuables on display or car keys in sight of the front door. Mark all property with your house number and post code using a permanent marker or UV pen. Police will never phone you and request you bank details or ask to you send your bank cards with pin number in the post as part of any investigation.
